Recycling Champions

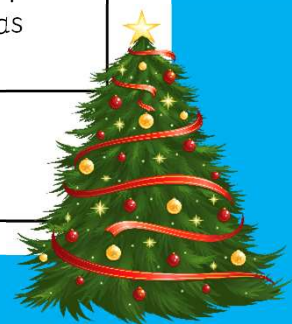
Chess Club: message from Miss Ward
